The forgiveness of sins,


The resurrection of the body

In the coming weeks, UUMC plans to step out in faith and expand our weekday Children's education programs to better serve the families in our community. By contributing to our "In the Neighborhood" campaign you will enable the church to continue these programs into the future and further the mission of UUMC.
